## Helping Your Child Become A Skilled READER

From our data analysis READING is 1 of our targeted site goals. Comprehension of text impacts student's progress, so how can you help at home?

### Questioning Before and After Reading - Fiction Books

#### Before:

*Focus on the front cover - talk about the title, the pictures and what the story may be about.*

#### After:

*Retell—being able to retell the story from the beginning to end is important—ask your child to retell the book in order and then ask some questions;*

- \* Who is the main character?
- \* Where is the story set (where does it take place)?

- \* Which part of the story was most exciting?
- \* What was the problem in the story?
- \* How was the problem solved?
- \* What are some other ways that you could end this story?
- \* Did you like the end of the story? Why/ why not?
- \* Could the events in the story happen in real life? Why/why not?

### Questioning After Reading - Non-Fiction Books

**Being able to recall relevant information from the text is important. To prompt and engage your child in discussion you could ask the following questions;**

- \* What was the main idea of the text?
- \* Did you use prior knowledge to help you understand new information in the text?
- \* Did you like this text? Why/why not?
- \* What did you learn from this text?
