From the Principal

Welcome back to school for 2022

Welcome to all families, new and returning, from all of the staff here at Marion Primary School. It has been an unusual start to the school year as we have negotiated the latest COVID challenges. We would like to thank all families for your support these past weeks as we have implemented the staggered return to face to face learning. It has been wonderful to welcome our new Reception students and returning year one students on site, and we are excited to be welcoming back all students in other year levels from next Monday. Thank you to all who have managed the remote learning tasks so well. Staff have again stepped up their ICT learning and delivery of learning programs and live classes using Microsoft Teams in Rooms 10 and 11; a combination of seesaw and live Zoom meetings in Rooms 6 and 7; and Seesaw and phone calls to families for year 2 students in rooms 3 and 4. Well done everyone on meeting the challenges of the first two weeks.

Language program 2022

Thank you to all who responded last year to the survey about our school language program. As you may recall, Senora Chavez increased her teaching days at Seaview High School as a result of the year 7 move to high school which left us without a Spanish teacher. This created the opportunity to review our language program options and the survey was conducted. The most popular option selected by parents and carers was AUSLAN - Australian Sign Language. All students will now learn AUSLAN as their Australian Curriculum language program. This will be taught by a new member of staff – Mrs Sarah Goodwin on Thursday and Friday.

Staffing updates

As you may recall at the end of 2021, our Deputy Principal Stacey Eichenberger was successful in gaining a promotion to a new position as the Head of Primary at Reynella East P-12 College. I would like to thank and acknowledge Stacey for her contribution to our school over the period of her tenure here at Marion Primary. She was a tireless worker on behalf of our students, a valued member of school leadership and staff team, and will be missed. At the same time it is my pleasure to welcome our new Deputy Principal Mrs Sue Sifa. Mrs Sifa joins us from Avenues B-12 College and brings with her a range of experience from Dept and Independent school settings here and interstate across a range of leadership positions.

Additionally, as we farewelled Mrs Whittaker from the front office role after 32 years of service to the Marion Primary School community, we welcome back Mrs Candia Thomas after her time at Plympton International College last year.

COVID restrictions and Acquaintance Night

COVID protocols are currently restricting many activities that we would normally run at the start of the year with no excursions or assemblies permitted in the first four weeks and no visitors, including parents, allowed on site (we are currently allowing pick up/drop off with mask wearing). SRC and special Fundraising 2021

Thanks to all parents, carers, families and friends for your contributions to fundraising for 2021. In addition to raising much needed funds for our school through our Governing Council Fundraising subcommittee, our Student Representative Council also undertook to raise money for several worthwhile charitable agencies. The results of the SRC fundraising were:

- Drink sale last day of term 4 2021, funds rasied were split between Neuroblastoma Australia (direct to the Jazmyn Mitchell page) \$48.00 and Camp Quality – \$48.00
- RSPCA Casual Day last day of school Term 3 funds raised = \$105.10
- The Smith Family Casual Day last day of school Term 4 funds raised = \$176.05

Also, Rooms 2 and 3 raised funds through sales to families of their canvas artwork in Term 4 with \$40.50 going to the **RSPCA** and a further \$40.50 going to **the World Wide Fund for Nature Australia**.
