### **School Dental Service**

Did you know - all babies, children and young people under 18 who either live or go to school in S.A. can attend a School Dental Service Clinic?

Dental care is free for all babies and children who haven't started school yet, or are covered by:

- The Child Dental Benefits Schedule (Medicare)
- A Pensioner Concession Card
- A Health Care Card
- A School Card

If your child is not covered, dental care will be \$50 a year. Any dental emergencies treated at a clinic between check-ups are also covered by this fee. games are played at the Springbank Secondary College, Pasadena.


Teams: U13 (mixed), U15 (mixed) and U17 (mixed), Season: Starts late April and finishes mid-September.
