# **Out of School Hours Care (OSHC)**

#### Starting school Transition – Preschool to Reception

In line with Government (Department for Education) policy, children must turn 5 years old on or before April 30<sup>th</sup> to start at the beginning of Term 1 of each year.

From 2024 there will be a mid-year intake into primary school. From 2024, if your child turns 5 years between 1 May and 31 October, they can start school in either: Term 3 of the same year or Term 1 the following year. Students enrolled through a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.

#### Communication

- The School Newsletter is uploaded to our website and a link is emailed to all families fortnightly on the even weeks of term
- Whole school communication comes out via EdSmart emails
- Class teachers use the SeeSaw app to communicate regularly with families.
- Parents and caregivers may make an appointment to meet with the Principal or school leadership at any time.

#### Canteen

Our canteen is run by an external provider on Thursdays and Fridays. Parents need to download the QKR application to access ordering and weekly menus. More details of this are provided in the welcome pack.



#### Medication

We are able to dispense regular medication prescribed by the doctor. There are a number of forms which have to be completed to do this. We cannot dispense any medication without a doctor's written authority.

#### **Additional Needs**

If you have concerns about your child's learning or they need additional support please let us know during enrolment so that we can provide ongoing support to them.

#### School Fee Schedule

A Material and Service Charges fee is charged each year. Parents who experience difficulty in meeting the financial load of school fees may request an extended payment period which will be treated with understanding and in strict confidence by the Principal and the School Finance Officer.

#### Uniform

The school's colours are **navy and sky blue (double blue)**. The school has a stock of monogrammed items.

Items are on display in the front foyer area and include:
